<b>Section II: Authorization</b> (Pursuant to L. 2009, ch. 92, §§ 1, 4)		
<p>The U.S. Attorney, Kansas Attorney General, any County or District Attorney, or any Assistant Attorney for any of those four agencies, now has the opportunity to become licensed to carry concealed weapons ("carry"), defined by K.S.A. 75-7c02 into county courthouses or court related facilities. However, the conditions enumerated below shall apply.</p>		
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The ability to carry into county court facilities is generally conditioned upon: (a) completing the necessary training for a Kansas CCH license and submitting an application to the attorney general; (b) receiving additional firearms training from the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Center; and (c) receiving approval from the prosecutor's respective agency head. For more information on the required KLETC training, please consult the instruction form found on the Attorney General's website, <a href="http://www.ksag.org">www.ksag.org</a>, under the concealed carry link. Agency approval shall be demonstrated below with the signature of the agency head.</li> <li>2. The authority to carry into county court facilities shall be subject to the discretion of each county commission through the newly amended provisions of K.S.A. 21-4218 - which outlines the requirements necessary for a county commission to opt out of allowing prosecutor carry into their county court facilities. L. 2009, ch. 92, § 3.</li> <li>3. Irrespective of a county commission's decision to allow concealed weapons into county court facilities, the authority to carry concealed weapons into any <b>courtroom</b> shall still be subject to the discretion of the chief judge of the judicial district. L. 2009, ch. 92, § 3.</li> </ol>
